Omega Again Named Top TKE Chapter

The men of Omega Chapter brought home more than memorable experiences and mouse ears from the 2019 Conclave in Orlando, Florida; they picked up some fresh hardware for the trophy case, too. For the second year in a row, Omega has been designated a Top TKE Chapter by the international fraternity, one of 17 in TKE Nation to earn the honor. The chapter previously won the Top TKE Chapter award in 1962, 1963, 1965, and 2018.

"I want to congratulate all of our 2018-2019 award winners," said Chief Executive Officer Donald E. Aldrich. "These chapters and individual Fraters are prime examples of Building a Championship Culture within TKE. Their dedication to excellence creates a positive impact on their campuses and in their communities. Thank you to the alumni, volunteers, and advisors who worked tirelessly and gave selflessly to make these honors a reality."

In addition, Fraters of Omega at Albion College are one of only 40 TKE chapters to achieve the 100 percent KRA Award distinction, recognizing their excellence in meeting Key Results goals in: Initiates; Average Chapter Size; Education; Philanthropy; Accounts Receivable; e-Compliance, an online training portal outline rights, responsibilities and expectations.

Philanthropy

During the 2018-19 Academic year, the men of Tau Kappa Epsilon raised more than \$6,700 for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and more than \$7,300 for charity as a whole. Omega Fraters participated in events including the *St. Jude run/walk, Tekes Go Bald for St. Jude,* and the annual pig roast. TKE also joined in other organization's charity events to help raise money including Alpha Chi Omega's *Walk a Mile in Her Shoes* and Delta Gamma Sorority's *Anchor Splash*.

Other philanthropic initiatives demonstrate TKE-Omega's commitment to love, charity and esteem by supporting diversity on campus and in the community. The chapter plans to work with the Ruth Ellis Center, a safe haven for LGBT+ children, teens, and adults by creating fundraisers benefiting LGBTI Prom for local high school students. The annual pig roast will take place in the Spring, as will the annual head shaving event benfiting St. Jude. (See more photos in Philanthropy, page 5.)





Never Too Late

Frater Craig Theros pledged the fraternity in 1978. It took 40 years to complete his initiation.

On April 13, the day of the Founder's Day Banquet, the Omega Chapter had the privilege of welcoming our newest member, Craig Theros.


Before the banquet, the active chapter and alumni participated in Craig's "official" initiation. The reason for putting quotes around initiation is because Craig had already gone through the process 40 years before. It's a story worth telling for all to appreciate the path we took to get to his initiation on April 13th.

Craig Theros attended Albion College his freshman year starting in the fall of 1978. In the spring of 1979 Craig pledged the Omega Chapter of TKE along with many of his Wesley 3rd Central hallmates including his friend and roommate Byron Konschuh, '82. Craig went through the entire pledge process and initiation with his pledge mates before the end of the spring semester. Craig did not return to Albion his sophomore year.

Jump forward 34 years to the 2013 Founder's Day Banquet held at Weber's Inn. Craig attended, along with many of his 1979 pledge mates, the initiation of George Constance, '79, as an honorary member. George was a strong supporter of TKE while he was at Albion College (and beyond), and as Craig's Resident Assistant (RA) at Wesley, a guiding influence for many of the men who joined in 1979. After the banquet there was a question about Craig's membership status. The reason for the question was that apparently his name was not listed on TKE headquarters' list of members for the Omega chapter. While interviewing some of his pledge mates it was confirmed that he went through the initiation process, yet somehow his name was not registered. Thinking this might have been just a clerical error, further investigation discovered that his name was not on the chapter's scroll. All his other pledge mates, in alphabetical order, were. It is not

entirely clear why his name was not on the scroll. Maybe it was because it was known at the time that he was not returning his sophomore year, or maybe because of an error in the initiation process. Regardless of the reason, it was an error requiring a solution. In conversations with Craig after the investigation, he was disappointed and sad, yet hoped the issue could be fixed.

With the planning of the 2019 Founder's Day celebration, the Board of Advisors agreed that it was the best time to correct the omission of Craig from our roster. The active chapter approved the motion to accept Craig into our chapter. An application was filed with TKE headquarters and quickly approved. On April 13th, almost 40 years from when Craig went through the process as a pledge, he was formally and "officially" initiated into the Omega chapter. His name is now on the scroll and listed on TKE HQ's roster.

I am so very proud and appreciative of the support the collegiate chapter gave to the Founder's Day celebration and for coordinating Craig's initiation. I am equally happy and proud to have Craig as our latest member. Regardless of the path to his initiation,



he is a man who is a Teke. He has remained in touch with several of his pledge mates over the years, he is active in his church and community, and frankly he's a great guy and is a welcomed addition to our fraternal family.
