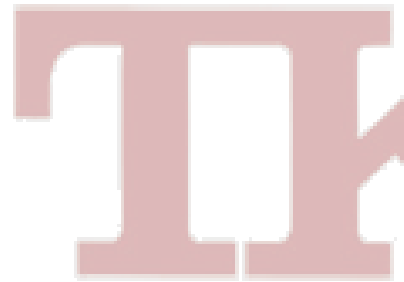

This is the beginning of another busy semester at Beta Eta. With the firepit and patio extension completed, we're looking for more improvements to make around the house. Congratulations to Rush Chairman Brenden Bratsch for "overfilling" the house with a 21-man class, upping the in-house total to 56. Big changes are coming to campus as the NIC (North American Interfraternity Council) imposes new policies on our local chapter of IFC (Interfraternity Council). The policies are still being worked on, but I will provide a short (and informal) summary below. If you are interested in viewing the policies verbatim, please visit <https://nicfraternity.org/ifcsop/> for more information.

The following summary of the new policies being imposed is informal, subject to change, and not comprehensive, but listed solely based on how significantly it will affect the chapter's operations:

- Chapters must average above 2.7 GPA annually or be above the All Male GPA Average, whichever is lower (we haven't had this issue in the past couple of years and we shouldn't any time soon)

- New members without a collegiate GPA must have above a 2.5 high school GPA to receive a bid, those with a collegiate GPA require a 2.5 or greater. Chapters may require higher, but not lower.

- A cap of social events per semester will be set equal to the average number of social events of all 18 fraternities

- Full membership in IFC is only granted to those who adopt the NIC Standards

The above by-laws and policies are to be implemented on **November 1st, 2019** unless further talks occur.

If you are available, please attend Homecoming at the TKE house, on October 4th, Bessie's slingers will be waiting.

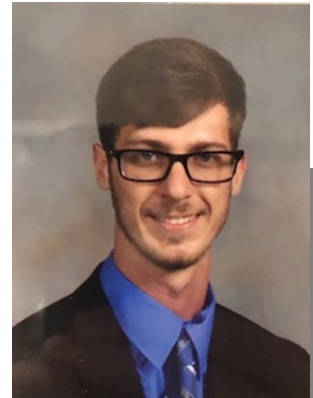


Vice President's Report

This semester there are several goals that my committees and I are trying to accomplish.
