

Alumni Tekes of Virginia Helping out "Nationals"

August 3rd, TKE National representative Herb Huser meet with regional TKE actives and Alumni at the Smokey Pig in Ashland, VA. As some of you already know TKE International has rethought and redefined its management of the 275 Teke chapters. Headquarters is transferring parts of its managing responsibilities from Indianapolis to the various regions managed by volunteers. Virginia and its six active chapters form one Province under the leadership of Herb Huser as Grand Province Advisor assisted by five (for now) Province Advisors. It is hoped that the new approach will make TKE International through its volunteers more accessible to the chapters. And it is also hoped that more frequent visits (at least three per year) will allow for greater and more convivial communications between the chapter and headquarters.

A fringe benefit from the formation of the Teke Virginia Province is a greater interaction between members of different chapters that could possibly lead to the creation take in the state of the chapter. Membership took a larger of a Central Virginia Alumni Association which in turn could become instrumental in bringing back the fallen Teke Chapters of UVA and VCU. All of this is still in its infancy and I thank Mark Cole and Darryl Morris for coming out to the Province Advisors meeting held in August to hear first hand some of these new developments.

On August 3rd Sebastian Völcker, Mark Cole, and I met with Herb Huser, the Grand Province Advisor and several representatives from the other VA chapters at the Smokey Pig in Ashland. We discussed a new idea for helping the active chapters with guidance and support. Nationals is trying to create a new system to better provide for the chapters' needs. TKE nationals wants alumni to volunteer for Regional Advisor positions. As a Regional Advisor you would work with individual chapters within a designated region. You are there as a liaison to nationals. You advise the chapter by national guidelines and the chapter comes to you with its concerns. The chapter gets the benefit of someone close in proximity to them and hopefully someone familiar to them. Nationals gets to save on finances and manpower. The alumni get an opportunity to be involved and maintain an active role in national activities. We also discussed the possibility of trying to start a new colony at UVA. State of the Chapter


