### Hallo from Deutschland

Major John Pastino, US Army, PK2, his Wife, Sharon and their sons Alex and Mathew, are in Germany. Here is his letter from Weselberg that's in the Rhineland-Palatinate close to the Franco German border, not far from Strasbourg for the geography buffs out there.

We have settled into our new home in Germany and are adjusting to a different culture. We live on the economy, renting a 3 level duplex in the village of Weselberg. (Pronounce "W" as



"V"). Weselberg is about 10 minutes from Landstuhl where I work. There are a lot of farmers in the town. The cows they own live right next to their houses and some only have a wall between them and the cow pen so the heat penetrates through the wall and helps keep the family house warm.



I'm the Chief of the Europe Regional Medical Command Contracting Cell located on the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center's Installation. My wife Sharon is a Neonatal Intensive Care Nurse working in the medical center and my two boys

Alex (8) and Matthew (6) go to a Department of Defense School located on the installation with me. So we're all close together and once and a while we have lunch together.

Alex and Matthew have adjusted well to their new environment and school. They both played soccer this fall on base. As the holidays neared, we went from soccer parents to "Play" parents. Alex auditioned for a play and had the part of "Hobie" in "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever." Over 80 children auditioned for 28 parts. We were very proud of him. Play practice and show times have been really time consuming, but worth the effort. I was also involved in the play running the lights.

Alex and Matthew love to visit our village *Backerei* (Bakery) and *Metzgerei* (Butcher.) The bread is fresh and melts in your mouth. The meats on the other hand are different. The sausage and bacon hangs on hooks in the store waiting for customers to buy it. The boys love to go to the *Backerei* and

then to the *Metzegerei* for some hard salami to put on their bread. They are definitely Italian! Sharon and I like to sample the beer and wine. We live close to the Rhine Valley that is famous for its wineries. The Christmas season and cold weather



brings "Gluwein," which is a mulled wine served warm. It helps take the chill of winter away and is very tasty.


We bought a used BMW that we cruise the autobahn in
